A case of Serogroup B Meningococcal disease (MenB) was confirmed at Syracuse University on October 5, 2018.¹

MenB Case Details¹

- October 2018 – 1 MenB case – Syracuse University undergraduate – student survived
- The Onondaga County Health Department is working closely with the New York State Department of Health and Syracuse University and will continue monitoring the situation

Seventy-eight percent (78%) of meningococcal disease cases in 10 to 25 year olds (18 cases) in New York between 2012 and 2017 were MenB.^{2*} Discuss the risk of MenB with your adolescent and young adult patients, along with their caregivers, and help protect students by administering recommended immunizations, including MenB.
